After graduating from Edinburgh, Chris worked in primary dental care, he then completed a MSc in Child Dental Health at Bristol University. Following this he moved to the University of Dundee. He became a Consultant in Paediatric Dentistry at Edinburgh Dental Institute in 2001 and took up a Chair in Paediatric Dentistry at University of Sheffield in 2006.

He had the honour of being appointed Dean of the School of Clinical Dentistry, University of Sheffield in 2015.

Chris was the Editor-in-Chief of the *International Journal of Paediatric Dentistry* for seven years from 2010. He is the Chair of Dental Schools Council and the Consultants in Paediatric Dentistry Group UK.

Chris is particularly interested in meticulous caries diagnosis and a founder member of International Caries Detection & Assessment System (ICDAS) Co-ordinating Committee.
