Peter Briggs

Consultant in Restorative Dentistry, Bart's and London Dental Institute, Specialist Practitioner, Hodsoll House Dental Practice

Peter qualified at King's College Hospital in 1983, completed his MSc at the Eastman in 1988, and completed his higher training in Restorative Dentistry in 1995. He was awarded a Winston Churchill Scholarship in 1994 and was appointed as a Consultant in Restorative Dentistry in South London in 1995. He has also worked as a specialist referral practitioner since 1995. He has published and educated widely and provided senior management and leadership within NHS Trusts, HEE & NHSE - Rest Dent LDN. He has been a past President of the British Society of Prosthodontics. He has worked at Bart's and the Royal London Dental Institute, Queen Mary University of London since 2015.



Phil Taylor

Professor in Prosthodontics, Clinical Director Dentistry and OMFS Barts Health NHS Trust, Consultant in Restorative Dentistry, Royal London Hospital

Phil qualified at Newcastle upon Tyne in 1981 and then spent 12 years in NHS general practice in the North East as an associate and practice owner. He completed his MSc at the Eastman in 1994, joined Queen Mary University of London in 1998 and became a consultant in 2003. Since then he has been the course organiser for the prosthodontic specialty training course there and has lectured widely on the subject. In March he became the President of the British Society of Prosthodontics. He will be speaking at the 100th anniversary of the American Academy of Prosthodontics in May 2018 and at the Malaysian Prosthodontic Society in October 2018.
